Language Arts

Sight Words: **sur** (on), **tu** (you), and **une** (a)

Routine: In our morning routine, we will continue to learn the colours in French, the days of the week, and we will look at today's, yesterday's, and tomorrow's date, and the weather. We will also do attendance.

Writing: This week, we are going to learn about some of the different celebrations around the world that are celebrated around this time of the year. We will learn their traditions, their stories, and do crafts/games related to their tradition.

Oral Communication: We will practice saying sentences learned throughout the year.

Math

We are continuing to count in French. We are going to see how far we can go. Can we count to 30? Can we skip count by 2's? Can we count backwards?

We will continue to look at different representations of numbers from 1-10 and trying to recognize them as quickly as possible, (hands, dots, tally, ten frames). We will match different representations of numbers together (ex: number with hands). We will count objects to 10 or more. We are naming the numbers and writing the numbers down.
