# Indigenous Learning & Black History Month

We are going to continue to learn about the 6<sup>th</sup> Seven Sacred Teachings of the Indigenous People which is Humility. The Wolf is the symbol for Humility. We are going to use this symbol in our classroom over the next few weeks to help us learn that Humility is asking for help when you need it, is being good at something and feeling proud of yourself, but at the same time not making someone else feel bad if they are not as good as you. We will also continue to talk about Black History Month and looking at important people that made a huge impact on Black History.

Learning Activities Week of Feb. 26 – March 1st, 2024

#### Language Arts

**Reading:** In Reading, our "**nouvel ami**" this week is **Louis Ours**, the sound is '**ou**'. Their homework this week will be David Dragon, sound 'd' their sight words are dans, danse, deux, and devant. Please continue to also review other sounds and sight words, especially the ones that are difficult.

Sight Words: ou (or), tout (all), and beaucoup (a lot),

**Routine:** In our morning routine, we will continue to learn the colours in French, the days of the week, and we will look at today's, yesterday's, and tomorrow's date, and the weather. We will also do attendance.

**Writing:** This week, we are going to write simple sentences, using a graphic organizer and a personal visual dictionary, while ensuring each sentence has a who, what, where and with who.

Ma maman marche au magasin avec un chien.

(My mom walks at the store with a dog.)

**Oral Communication:** We will practice saying the same sentences they will be writing.

### <u>Math</u>

We are continuing to count in French. We are going to see how far we can go. Can we make it to 50 this term? Can we skip count by 2's to 10, 5's to 50, and 10's to 50? Can we count backwards from 10? Can we read and write our numbers up to 20?

We will continue to look at different representations of numbers from 1-10 and trying to recognize them as quickly as possible, (hands, dots, tally, ten frames, rekenrek, number) and explain how they know.

We will be identifying a number or showing a quantity of objects that is smaller, bigger, or equal to a given number
