Learning Activities Week of February 19 – 23rd, 2024

Language Arts

Reading: In Reading, our "**nouvel ami**" this week is **David Dragon**, the sound is '**d**'. Their homework this week will be Brigitte Baleine, sound 'b' their sight words are beau, belle, bon and bonne. Please continue to also review other sounds and sight words, especially the ones that are difficult.

Sight Words: dans (in), **danse** (dance), **deux** (2), and **devant** (in front),

Routine: In our morning routine, we will continue to learn the colours in French, the days of the week, and we will look at today's, yesterday's, and tomorrow's date, and the weather. We will also do attendance.

Writing: This week, we are going to continue to look at careers or trades the students have chosen to be when they are older and where they will work. We will also create simple sentences, using who, what, where, and with who?

Oral Communication: We will practice saying the same sentences they will be writing.

<u>Math</u>

We are continuing to count in French. We are going to see how far we can go. Can we make it to 50 this term? Can we skip count by 2's and 5's to 10? Can we count backwards from 10? Can we read and write our numbers up to 20?

We will continue to look at different representations of numbers from 1-10 and trying to recognize them as quickly as possible, (hands, dots, tally, ten frames, rekenrek, number) and explain how they know.

We will be measuring length, surface, volume, and capacity.
