Language Arts

Reading: In Reading, our "**nouvels amis**" this week are **Gabrielle Grenouille**, the sound is 'g' and **Hubert Hibou**, the sound is 'h'. Their homework this week will be to continue with Ève Escargot, the sound 'è' and her sight words are elle, est, and est-ce que. Please continue to also review other sounds and sight words, especially the ones that are difficult.

Sight Words: grand/grande (tall), **gros/grosse** (big), **combien** (how many), **and aime** (love/like)

Routine: In our morning routine, we will continue to learn the colours in French, the days of the week, and we will look at today's, yesterday's, and tomorrow's date, and the weather. We will also do attendance.

Writing: Next week, they are going to start learning how to write complete sentences on their own following a graphic organizer.

Oral Communication: We will practice saying the same sentences they will be writing.

<u>Math</u>

We are continuing to count in French. We are going to see how far we can go. Can we make it to 50 this term? Can we skip count by 2's to 10? Can we count backwards from 10? Can we read and write our numbers up to 20?

We will continue to look at different representations of numbers from 1-10 and trying to recognize them as quickly as possible, (hands, dots, tally, ten frames, rekenrek, number) and explain how they know.

We are representing numbers up to 20 using hands, rekenrek, dots, ten frames, and with cubes.

We are subtracting 2 numbers with digits up to 10.
