Language Arts

Reading: In Reading, we are going to be learning sounds in French. Every sound is accompanied with an animal. We call them our friend (ami) and there is also a song that goes with each sound. Our "**nouvel ami**" is **Martin Mouton**, the sound is '**m**'. Their homework this week will be **Aline Abeille**, the sound '**a**' and their sight words from last week, **ami, amie**, and, **papa**.

Sight Words: ma (my)and maman (mom)

Routine: In our morning routine, we will learn the colours in French, the days of the week, and we will look at today's and yesterday's date.

Writing: We are finishing our project on, 'All About Me'. They are going to continue writing whole sentences, while following the teacher's models. They will need to be able to change their information to their own. Here is what they are going to write about:
